Christy is the founding director of the Complex

and Aging Care service line she developed at Crouse Hospital five years ago. In this role she has brought several bestpractice programs to Crouse, including NICHE (Nurses Improving the Care of Healthsystem Elders), HELP (Hospital Elder Life Program) and the Care Transitions Intervention. In addition, she has led Crouse's participation in several grantfunded regional and national collaboratives, including the Medicare Innovations Collaborative, Improving Care Processes for Patients with Sensory Loss, Stop CAUTI, and Improving Transitions of Care through Family Caregiver Partnership. Christy is a frequent speaker on the business development of a geriatric service line, leadership, and patient self management. Her recent book "Reducing Readmissions: A Blueprint for Improving Care Transitions," co-written with Eric Coleman, MD, MPH, provides a detailed look at effective and innovative programs to reduce readmissions and offers a blueprint for hospitals to develop a comprehensive readmission reduction program based on sound leadership practices.

Complex Care and IMPARA Advisory Committee member Christy Bond will detail what you as a health care consumer can do to protect yourself, as well as some of the ways Crouse is working to end this sad and costly spiral of decline.

Most of all, Christy credits her 97-year-old grandmother as her primary source of information on how to age actively.
